


You'll travel with a veteran staff which includes an Expedition Leader and Historian.

She measures 384 feet in length — five times the length of Christopher Columbus' flagship, *Santa Maria*. Her masts reach a height equivalent to that of a 20-story building. And her outstretched yardarms carry almost 30,000 square feet of canvas — enough to cover a city block. Wrapped around her bow is a golden eagle, beckoning you to board.

Sea Cloud II is a three-masted barque — and sailing on her is an experience unto itself, bringing us back to the exhilarating and romantic tradition of a hand-sailed square-rigged tall ship. The key is hand-sailed. There are plenty of mechanized or "push-button" sailing ships out there, but when a square-rigged ship is hand-sailed, it means that everyone onboard is dedicated primarily to the experience of sailing. And, although equipped with auxiliary engines, Sea Cloud II is capable of great speed under sail. Overhead, you'll watch nimble crew members climb hundreds of feet above the rigging, setting and adjusting our trim — a thrilling experience.

"Watching the crew go aloft the first time, loosening the gaskets on the sails, seeing in reality what we had only watched in movies come to life, brought tears to our eyes. When wind and sea fully cooperated, the result was so exhilarating that, like the Captain, we all stood with stupid smiles on our faces, as we felt the enormous power of the wind sweeping her along."




ALLHANDS ON

Once aboard, you are treated to a variety of workshops on seafaring skills and interests — to increase your appreciation of your voyage. Learn about sailing strategy and why certain sails are being set. There'll be a stem to stern guided walk that will prepare you with terminology and an understanding of square-rigger sail maneuvers. Learn to tie knots, use a sextant or make a ballywrinkle. At night come up on deck for stargazing sessions.



Of course, to genuinely sail a hand-sailed ship means that you have to construct itineraries with consideration for prevailing winds and the time to sail. Beginning and ending in Barbados, *Sea Cloud II* sails two itineraries, seeking the natural features of the Leeward and Windward islands — the twin volcanic peaks and bubbling sulphur springs of St. Lucia and the lush rain forests of Dominica, as well as colonial towns, historic forts and botanical gardens. Learn about reef ecology as you snorkel (we provide gear) among colorful corals and tropical fish.

The Natural Wonders of the Caribbean

Our winter exploration visits some of the loveliest of the Caribbean in grand style aboard *Sea Cloud II*. You'll explore a wonderland that few travelers are privileged to see: the many out-of-the-way anchorages and natural features of the Lesser Antilles.


Dominica is a dramatic island of physical beauty with a strong commitment to conservation. Much of the island has been designated as reserves. Anchor in Prince Rupert Bay near 18th-century Fort Shirley. After a short walk to the ruins, it's up to the hills and the green rain forest.

The mountainous island of **St. Lucia** looms ahead as we make our approach. Dolphins often herald our arrival. We anchor at Soufrière Bay, beneath the twin peaks of Les Pitons. On a stroll through this charming town, hear the lilting sounds of *Patois*, the local mixture of French and Creole. Explore an active thermal area, full of steam vents and bubbling pools.

Iles de Saintes is a small cluster of islands near Guadeloupe. Walk through the French-speaking village with time to browse the local shops and stop at a café. Swim and snorkel from pristine beaches, and go ashore in the evening to enjoy the nightlife.

The Grenadines offer incredible snorkeling and reef viewing opportunities from white coral beaches. Spend time exploring the tropical cays and join a visit to the sea turtle sanctuary. Stroll the quaint waterfront at tiny Bequia.

These are among the highlights of our itineraries. Most importantly you'll enjoy the exhilarating feeling of traveling under sail aboard *Sea Cloud II* in one of the world's gentlest climates. We hope to see you on board.



photographs of the *Sea Cloud II*under sail from the vantage of our
Zodiacs. (B,L,D)

Day 5: Under Sail/Soufrière & Les Pitons, St. Lucia

After a morning's sailing, we anchor under the iconic twin peaks of St. Lucia, called "Les Pitons." Drive





through the active crater, plunge under a tropical waterfall, explore the beautiful botanical gardens, and finish with an incredible view from the hills above. (B,L,D)

Day 6: Under Sail/Bequia, the Grenadines

After a morning's sailing, we arrive at tiny Bequia. Stroll the quaint waterfront, swim and snorkel, or visit the sea turtle sanctuary. Have dinner aboard, or if you wish, take in the laid-back evening scene ashore. (B,L,D)

Day 7: The Grenadines/Under SailContinue exploring the Grenadines. Take a final swim and snorkel before the *Sea Cloud II* sails back

Day 8: Barbados/Disembark/ Home

to Barbados. (B,L,D)

After breakfast, disembark in Barbados. Proceed to the airport for flights home or onto other adventures. (B)

DAILY EXPEDITION REPORT • DEC 24, '07 ABOARD SEA CLOUD II

fter lunch some of us decided to explore the underwater world just down the shore from the ship in the Cabrits National Park. For me, warm clear water teeming with tropical fish was the perfect way to spend the day before Christmas. (It certainly beats shoveling snow!) Massive barrel sponges covered the bottom, some large enough that a human could probably fit inside. Fish life was diverse and abundant, with damselfish, parrotfish, and wrasses being dominant."



walk with our Historian up to Fort Napoleon for panoramic vistas. This afternoon we set sail in the Guadeloupe Channel, where the winds fill the square sails in a glorious spectacle. Conditions permitting, we'll lower Zodiacs so you can photograph the *Sea Cloud II* under sail. (B,L,D)

Day 5: Under Sail/Falmouth Bay, Antigua

After a morning's sailing, we arrive at Falmouth Bay in Antigua, in the heart of historic Nelson's Dockyard. This was the Caribbean center of the British Navy, with a convoluted shoreline rich in square-rigged history. Join our Historian and local guides for an orientation to the bays, then take a stroll on your own. Or you may wish to take a taxi to a nearby beach. (B,L,D)



Day 6: Prickly Pear Cay, Anguilla/ Under Sail

Today is devoted to relaxing and swimming from a remote white-sand beach on one of Anguilla's offshore islands, Prickly Pear Cay. Later, we hoist sails and aim for an overnight sail toward the British Virgin Islands. (B,L,D)

Day 7: Under Sail/Jost Van Dyke, British Virgin Islands

Sail through the scenic islands of the Sir Francis Drake Channel. Anchor at lovely Jost Van Dyke to hike, swim or snorkel. (B,L,D)

Day 8: Virgin Gorda

Take a morning excursion from Spanish Town to "The Baths," stunning formations of granite boulders that create grottoes, pools of water, arches and tunnels. It's one of the Caribbean's classic natural sights. Rejoin the ship in North Bay, and visit the landmark Bitter End Yacht Club. (B,L,D)

Day 9: St. Barts

Once belonging to Sweden and now characteristically French, Saint-Barthelemy remains unique in its character, culture, and lifestyle appeal. Stroll the harbor to explore the old Swedish architecture or the modern yachts or shop at the local boutiques. Take a swim at the famous Shell Beach, rent a car or scooter to tour the island. Have dinner on board or dine in. (B,L,D)

Day 10: St. Kitts

With a mountainous interior and rugged coastline, St. Kitts is striking. Drive through coastal villages to the imposing Brimstone Hill Fortress National Park.

A UNESCO site, the views from the top of this volcanic mound are stunning. Then drive to Romney Manor and Gardens, which is an old sugar plantation that now houses the Caribelle Batik Studio. This afternoon we will swim or sail, depending on conditions. (B,L,D)

Day 11: At Sea, Under Sail

The day is devoted to being at sea, under sail. Take a stem-to-stern tour of the ship's sails and rigging, or head up to the Bridge. Then enjoy the impeccable service and cuisine as the almost-lost art of being at sea under sail begins to feel very natural. (B,L,D)

Day 12: Soufrière & Les Pitons, St. Lucia

This morning we anchor under the iconic twin peaks of St. Lucia, called "Les Pitons." Drive through the active crater, plunge under a tropical waterfall, explore the beautiful botanical gardens, and finish with an incredible view from the hills above. In the afternoon, we sail southward. (B,L,D)

Day 13: Under Sail/Bequia, the Grenadines

After a morning's sailing, we arrive

at tiny Bequia. Stroll the quaint waterfront, swim and snorkel, or visit the sea turtle sanctuary. Enjoy dinner aboard, or if you wish, take in the laid-back evening scene ashore. (B,L,D)

Day 14: Exploring the Grenadines/Under Sail

The day is devoted to exploring the idyllic Grenadines, with their quint-essential tropical cays. We'll look for a white coral beach for swimming and snorkeling. We spend time under sail, before heading back to Barbados. (B,L,D)

Day 15: Barbados/Disembark/ Home (B)





A celebration of a bygone era, with modern luxury.

The vision for Sea Cloud II was to build a classic tall ship for the 21st century that would capture the romance of The Age of Sail and combine it with present-day comfort. Sea Cloud II naturally doesn't accommodate a large number of guests, just 86, but those who do join stay in spacious staterooms and suites, each with its individual charm. The Owner's Suites (bottom right) on Lido Deck have decorative fireplaces, natural woodwork and nostalgic marble baths with gold fittings. The lovely Category 2 cabins on the Promenade Deck have two windows (opposite page) and Cabin Deck cabins have two portholes. The lounge provides comfortable seating in rich mahogany surroundings. The sauna/fitness room, too, is so aglow and inviting you may be diverted from yet another lungful of tangy sea air on deck for a session on the elliptical trainer. The small library, a sun-filled salon with windows overlooking the forepeak, is another appealing retreat, its cabinets filled with art books, travel guides and coffee-table volumes on sailing (there's also a laptop for sending e-mails, so you stay in contact with family and friends back home). No detail has been overlooked.

Category 1:

Cabin Deck 211, 212, 214-217, 224-231 — Located on the Cabin Deck these cabins have two portholes, sofa, table, queen-size bed with two separate mattresses. Sole Occupancy: 205, 206 — Cabins are in the traditional windjammer style with upper and lower beds. They are located on the Cabin Deck each with two portholes, chair, table.

Category 2:

Cabin Deck 218-223; Sole Occupancy: 207-210 — These comfortable cabins located on the Cabin Deck have two portholes, sofa, table, safe and queen-size bed with two separate mattresses. Promenade 301, 302 — Located on the Promenade Deck these cabins have two portholes, sofa, table and queen-size bed with two separate mattresses.

Category 3:

Promenade Deck 303-312, 314-319 — These spacious Junior Suites are located on the Promenade Deck. Cabins have panoramic windows, sofa*, table, chair, decorative fireplace, queen-size bed with two separate mattresses and bath with tub and shower. *Note: There are no sofas in cabins 303 & 304.

Category 4:

Lido Deck 401, 402 — Owner's Suites are located on the Lido Deck. Cabins have panoramic windows, sofa, table, chair, desk, decorative fireplace, king-size canopy bed with two separate mattresses and bath with tub and separate shower.

Shared accommodations: We will make arrangements for shares at the double occupancy rate in Category 1 only.

Capacity: 86 guests in 46 outside cabins.

Registry: Malta. Overall length: 384 feet.

Public areas: Lido Deck & Bar; Lounge; Library; Dining Room; Boutique; Purser's Office; Reception; Fitness Center with Sauna & Shower; Hospital. The Bridge is a focal point, open to all guests.

Meals: Served in single seatings with unassigned tables for easy mingling in a congenial personal atmosphere. Menu is a touch of Nouvelle Cuisine, enhanced by regional specialties. Complimentary fine wines and beers are served with lunch and dinner. Sunset cocktail hours are held nightly at the Lido Bar.

Cabins: All cabins feature outside-facing portholes or windows, sitting area, television with VCR. Each cabin has mini bar, dressing table, closet, safe, private bath with gold-plated fixtures, marble sink, hairdryer, outlet for razor and deluxe amenities. There is ample storage in each cabin.

Special Features: Guest e-mail station, Wellness, laundry service. A ship's doctor is also onboard. The *Sea Cloud II* is a "genuine" barque — a three-masted sailing ship with two fully-rigged masts and a spanker — making her one of the most beautiful ships in the world. She has four decks with a ratio of 1.4 crew per guest. It is equipped with the most advanced navigation system, very important when the 29,687 square feet of sail are deployed.

If the expedition that interests you provides more than one savings opportunity (e.g. it is eligible for Early Booking and Kids savings), we won't make you choose between them — you may combine up to 2 offers from any of the applicable savings offers.

Costs Include: All accommodations aboard ship, all meals and nonalcoholic beverages aboard ship, wine and beer with lunch and dinner, shore excursions, sightseeing and entrance fees, special access permits, transfers to and from group flights, use of snorkeling equipment, taxes and service charges, and services of our expedition staff and ship's doctor.

Conditions were perfect, so crew went aloft to set more sails: even the skysail and royal sail were set on the mainmast... We enjoyed the afternoon at White Bay on Jost Van Dyke. It was calm and warm, just perfect for swimming, walking, snorkeling or taste-testing 'painkillers' — a local rum drink... Underwater there were enormous schools of small, silvery fishes. As large fish swam near them, the schools magically moved aside — thousands of small fish moving in tight coordination as if they were one organism... Above water, there were lots of pelicans and brown boobies. Most exciting was to see a plunge diving bird suddenly appear just two feet away from our masks.
