### **ABOUT THE SHIP**

**MS** *MSC Divina* is a cruise ship owned and operated by MSC Cruises. She was constructed from 2010 to 2012, and was originally called the *MSC Fantastica* until the company renamed her to honor the actress Sophia Loren. She entered service in May 2012, and is handling cruises in the Caribbean. She is a *Fantasia*class cruise ship, built after her running mates, *MSC Splendida* and *MSC Fantasia*, and followed up by the *MSC Preziosa*. She is the twelfth ship in MSC's fleet, and is the largest of their ships at 139,400 tons. She can accommodate 3,959 passengers in 1,637 cabins her crew complement is 1,325. The ship was delivered to MSC Cruises on May 19, 2012, with her christening scheduled for



May 26 in Marseille, France. The ship is 333 m (1,092.52 ft) long and carries up to 3,959 passengers and 1,325 crew members. She has 13 passenger decks, which contain 1,310 outside cabins and 327 inside cabins. Her speed is quoted at 23 knots (43 km/h; 26 mph). She is the twelfth ship in MSC's fleet, and the largest of their ships at 139,400 tons. De Jorio Design International designed the deck to be different from her sister ships, and added a new restaurant. The MSC Yacht Club area was redesigned and enlarged. Other amenities include a rear lounge, casino' disco, and an infinity pool. The MSC Aurea Spa has treatments ranging from Balinese massage to sauna and whirlpools. The ship also features a "4D" cinema and a Formula 1 simulator.

### ABOUT THE ITINERARY

**Barcelona**: Founded as a Roman city, in the Middle Ages Barcelona became the capital of the County of Barcelona. After merging with the Kingdom of Aragon, Barcelona continued to be an important city in the Crown of Aragon. Besieged several times during its history, Barcelona has a rich cultural heritage and is today an



important cultural centre and a major tourist destination. Particularly renowned are the architectural works of Antoni Gaudí and Lluís Domènech i Montaner, which have been designated UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The headquarters of the Union for the Mediterranean is located in Barcelona. The founding of Barcelona is the subject of two different legends. The first attributes the founding of the city to the mythologicalHercules. The second legend attributes the foundation of the city directly to the historical Carthaginian Hamilcar Barca, father of Hannibal, who

named the city Barcino after his family in the 3rd century BC.

**Naples**: is the capital of the Italian region <u>Campania</u> and the third-largest municipality in <u>Italy</u>, after <u>Rome</u> and

<u>Milan</u>. As of 2012, around 960,000 people live within the city's administrative limits. The Naples urban area has a population of between 3 million and 3.7 million. Around 4 million people live in the <u>Naples metropolitan area</u>, one of the largest metropolises on the <u>Mediterranean Sea</u>. Naples was greatly respected by the Romans as a paragon of Hellenistic culture. During the Roman era, the people of Naples maintained their Greek language and customs, while the city was expanded with elegant Roman villas, aqueducts, and public baths. Landmarks such as the Temple of Dioscures were built, and many emperors chose to holiday in the city, including Claudius and Tiberius. Virgil, the author of



Rome's national epic, the *Aeneid*, received part of his education in the city, and later resided in its environs. It was during this period that Christianity first arrived in Naples; the apostles Peter and Paul are said to have preached in the city. Januarius, who would become Naples' patron saint, was martyred there in the fourth century AD. The last emperor of the Western Roman Empire, Romulus Augustulus, was exiled to Naples by the Germanic king Odoacer in the fifth century AD.



**Civitavecchia**: is a town and *comune* of the province of Rome in the central Italian region of Lazio. A sea port on the Tyrrhenian Sea, it is located 50 mile west-north-west of Rome, across the Mignone river. The harbor is formed by two piers and a breakwater, on which is a lighthouse. The name Civitavecchia means "ancient town". The modern city was built over a preexisting Etruscan settlement. The harbor was constructed by the Emperor Trajan at the beginning of the 2nd century. The first occurrence of the name **Centum Cellae** is from a letter by Pliny the

Younger . The origin of the name is disputed: it has been suggested that it could refer to the *centum* halls of the villa of the emperor. In the high Middle Ages *Centumcellae* was a Byzantine stronghold. Raided by the Saracens in 828, it was later acquired by the Papal States. The place became a free port under Pope Innocent XII in 1696 and by the modern era was the main port of Rome. The French occupied it in 1849. On 16 April 1859 the Rome and Civitavecchia Rail Road was opened for service. The Papal troops opened the gates of the fortress to the Italian general Nino Bixio in 1870. During World War II, Allied bombings severely damaged Civitavecchia, and caused civilian casualties.

La Spezia: in the local dialect of Ligurian), at the head of the Gulf of La Spezia in the Liguriaregion of northern Italy, is the capital city of the province of La Spezia. Located between Genoa and Pisa on the Ligurian Sea, it is one of the main Italian military and commercial harbours and hosts the arsenal of the Italian Navy. It is important for its museums, for the Palio del Golfo, and for the railway and boat links with Cinque Terre. The area of La Spezia has been settled since pre-historic times. In Roman times the most important centre was Luni, now located in the vicinity of Sarzana (city near La Spezia). Being the capital of the short-lived Niccolò Fieschi Signoria in the period between 1256



and 1273, inevitably linked with the Genoese vicissitudes until the fall of the Republic of Genoa, it grew and changed to develop following the lines of the Ligurian capital. In fact, this Ligurian influence still is visible in the urban layout as well as in the types of buildings and decorations



**Cannes**: is a city located in the French Riviera. It is a busy tourist destination and host of the annual Cannes Film Festival and <u>Cannes Lions International Advertising Festival</u>. It is a commune of France located in the Alpes-Maritimes department. In the 10th century the town was known as Canua. The name may derive from "canna", a reed. Canua was probably the site of a small Ligurian port, and later a Roman outpost on Le Suquet hill, suggested by Roman tombs discovered here. Le Suquet housed an 11th-century tower which overlooked swamps where the city now stands. Most of the

ancient activity, especially protection, was on the Lérins islands and the history of Cannes is the history of the islands.

**Palma de Mallorca**: the island's only true city. A city on the island of Mallorca, one of the Balearic Islands off the Spanish east coast. Palma de Mallorca, the capital of the Balearic Islands, is the largest city in Mallorca; the population of the Palma municipality was approximately 400,000 at the beginning of 2007. Half the population of Mallorca lives in the city of Palma. Palma de Mallorca, during the 19th century, more sea traffic would come in bringing in much economic growth for the island. Today, Mallorca is one of Europe's major holiday destinations, with many tourists coming from everywhere, every year. Palma is a city of modern, hotel chains, and flashy



shops, yet, is dated and still retains much of the old architecture, with the Old Town having narrow streets, and showing the restored cathedral standing proud in the center of town.
