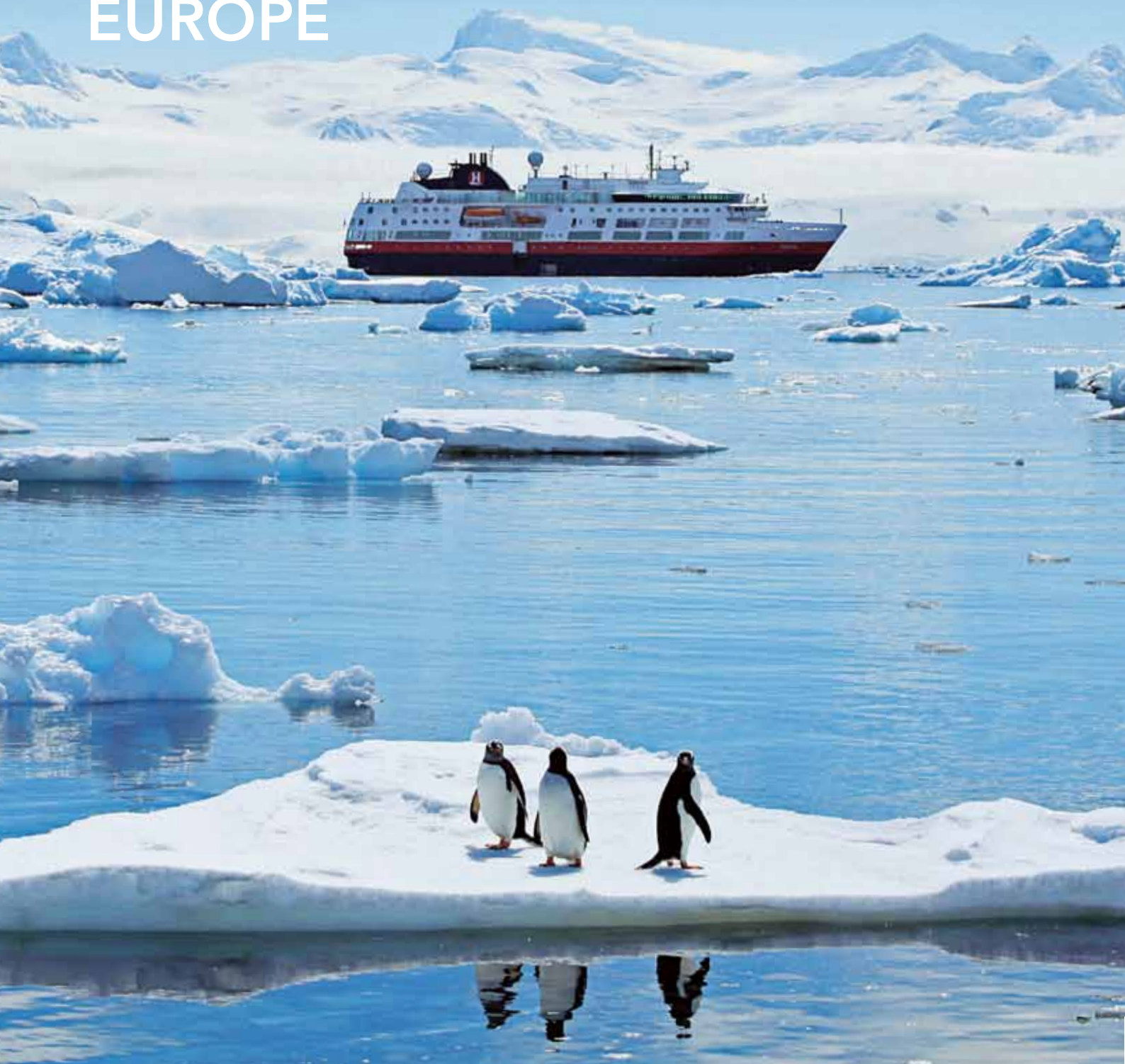

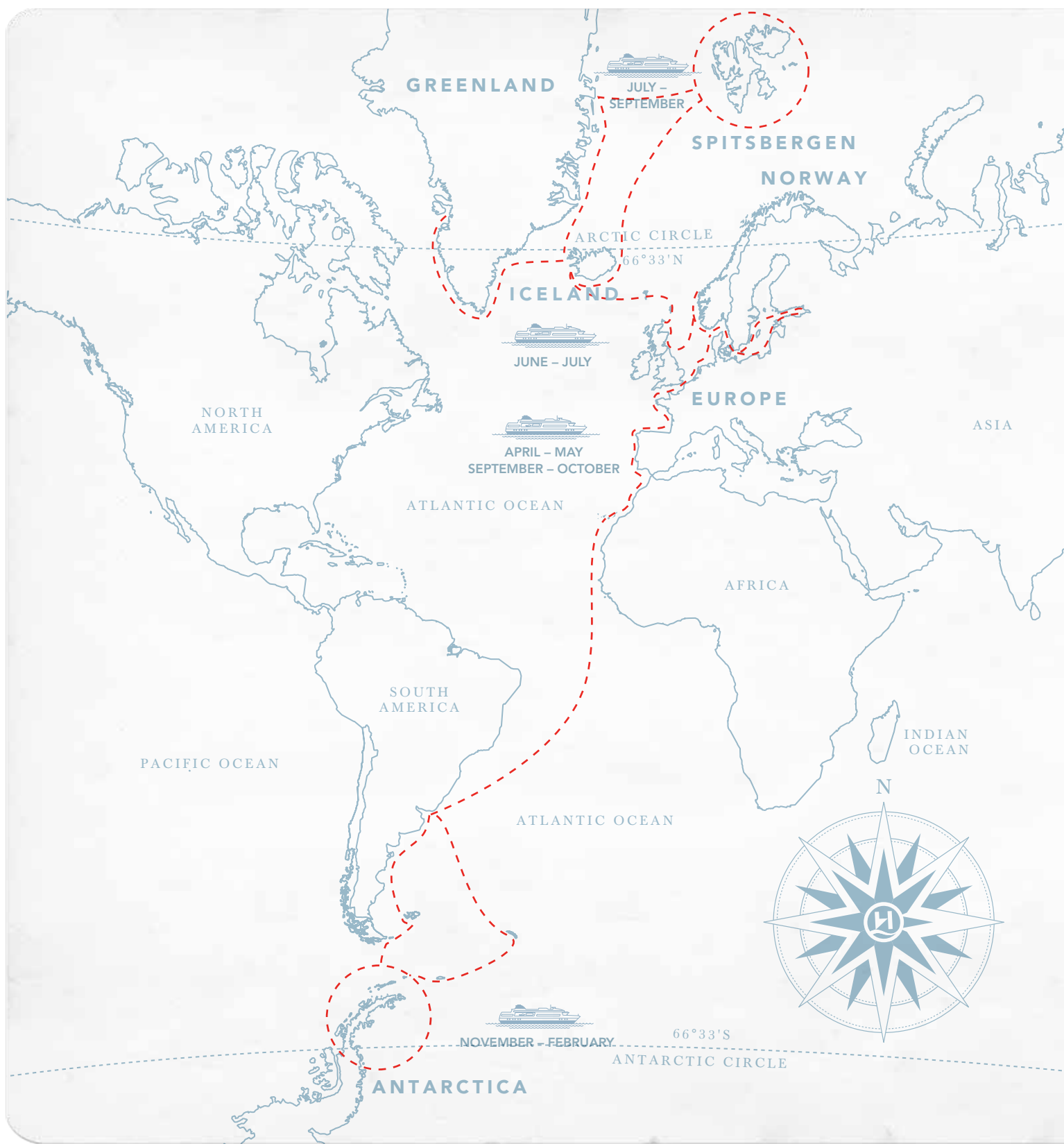

IAATO AND AECO

Hurtigruten is a full member of the International Association of Antarctica Tour Operators (www.iaato.org), which promotes safe and environmentally responsible travel to Antarctica. In addition, both Hurtigruten and Spitsbergen Travel are full members of the Association of Arctic Expedition Cruise Operators (www.aeco.no), an international organisation which ensures that tourism in the Arctic is carried out with the utmost consideration for the vulnerable natural environment, local cultures and cultural remains. Membership of these organisations comes with responsibilities and guidelines, both for Hurtigruten as an operator and you as a visitor.

CLEAN UP SVALBARD

All visitors to Svalbard are invited to contribute to the Clean Up Svalbard programme. This is a collective effort, managed by the Governor of Svalbard, to help clean up the beaches and remove evidence of pollution and shipboard waste. We encourage everyone to take part in this programme on selected landings.

SVALBARD ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FUND

All visitors to Svalbard pay a small environmental fee that goes towards protecting the environment and its cultural heritage. This is an obligatory fee and is incorporated into the airfare, with all funds going towards the ongoing effort of taking care of Svalbard's precious environment.

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FRAM AND THE ARCTOS NETWORK

On some of our longer voyages in the Arctic we make the MS Fram available to a network of marine biologists, to use as a base of operations for research. In 2008 two teams sailed to Thule in Greenland, taking samples from the seabed whilst the ship was underway, whilst in 2009 another team undertook field research into species of giant sea weed in the high Arctic, using the MS Fram as a mobile scientific platform. Hurtigruten is also a member of the steering committee of an EU funded research project called the Arctic Tipping Point. The intention is to offer the MS Fram to future projects, continuing our commitment to conservation and research within the scientific community.

Our ships have been an integral part of the Norwegian coastal life for over a century, crossing the Arctic Circle to sail into the Norwegian Arctic tens of thousands of times. In 1896, Hurtigruten's founder, Captain Richard With established a route to Svalbard, and established a hotel there especially for his guests. To skipper these Arctic voyages, With hired the most competent Captain of them all, the master of Nansen's Fram, Otto Sverdrup.

The original Fram, commissioned by oceanographer and explorer Fridtjof Nansen, quickly became the most famous vessel of its time. The combined achievements of Fram's three famous expeditions are unparalleled; she was the first ship to drift across the Arctic Ocean and on her second expedition, Captain Otto Sverdrup surveyed a larger area of the Earth than any other previous expedition – the Canadian territory of Nunavut. And most famous of all – she took Roald Amundsen to the Bay of Whales where base camp Framheim was constructed and used as the starting point for his race to the South Pole against Britain's Robert Falcon Scott. Today, MS Fram travels in the wake of these great explorers and is the most modern ship in our fleet, specially designed for sailing the Arctic and Antarctic waters. For Nansen, Amundsen and Sverdrup Fram was a vessel for broadening the perspective of the world – let MS Fram be the same for you.

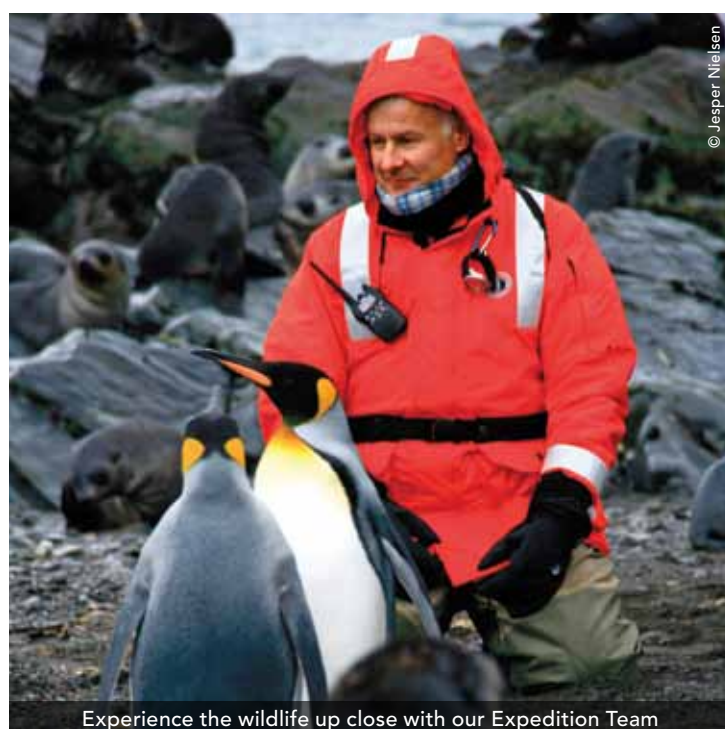

80% of Greenland's 2.1 million km² are covered by ice and we recommend you always have your camera handy as icebergs of every imaginable shape and size may appear at any time, leaving memories that will last a lifetime.

THE HEART OF GREENLAND

See Sermeq Kujalleq up close - the most productive glacier in the Northern Hemisphere

This expedition along Greenland's west coast is a fascinating meeting with the Inuit culture and the stunning land they inhabit. Only accessible by boat, the small settlements give you a genuine picture of Greenlandic life. The spectacular scenery and Midnight Sun provide a stunning backdrop for the voyage.

VOYAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 Copenhagen/Kangerlussuaq

Begin your Greenland experience in Copenhagen with our specially chartered flight to Kangerlussuaq, the main gateway to Greenland. Situated close to the majestic inland ice that covers more than 80 % of Greenland, this desert-like place is home to only 600 people.

DAY 2 Sisimiut

Sisimiut is the second largest community in Greenland. Here you'll find fishing trawlers, a shipyard and a busy fish processing factory. We recommend a visit to the arts and crafts workshop close to the pier. Here you may watch the local craftsmen create traditional jewellery and purchase local souvenirs.

DAY 3 Qeqertarsuaq

Qeqertarsuaq is situated on the old volcanic island of Disko and plays host to the Arctic Station, part of Copenhagen University, studying flora, fauna and the climate. Enjoy a stroll along the beach with its grounded icebergs or join the highly recommended walking tour to Blæsedalen, an area rich in high Arctic flora.

DAY 4 Uummannaq/Ukkusissat

The town of Uummannaq is situated in scenic surroundings at the foot of a 1170m heart-shaped mountain. Here, you may join a walking tour, or just stroll around this beautiful town on your own. In the evening we will be calling Ukkusissat, a traditional hunting and fishing settlement of about 190 welcoming inhabitants.

DAY 5 Eqip Sermia

The five kilometre glacier front of Eqip Sermia is constantly calving icebergs. Here you will have an outstanding possibility to experience the glacier and sense the grandeur of nature.

DAY 6 Ilulissat

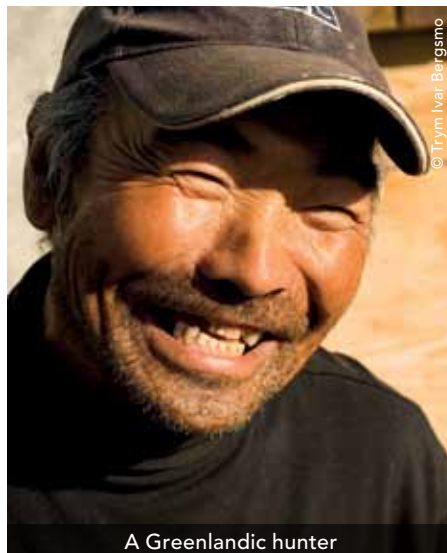
Ilulissat means iceberg in Greenlandic, and this town lives up to its name. The most productive glacier in the Northern Hemisphere, Sermeq Kujalleq feeds enormous bergs into the Ilulissat Icefjord. As a result this area is on UNESCO's list of World Heritage sites.

DAY 7 Itilleq

This small isolated settlement close to the Arctic Circle is home to about 130 inhabitants who make their living by traditional fishing and hunting. Itilleq always welcomes us for

an active stay in their settlement to give us a closer understanding of their culture.

DAY 8 Kangerlussuaq

In the early 1960's 27 Musk oxen were introduced to Kangerlussuaq from north east Greenland and today their numbers are over 10,000. We will have time for a closer look at the area before our evening flight to Copenhagen.

DAY 9 Kangerlussuaq/Copenhagen

Arrival in Copenhagen next day.

ILULISSAT ICEFJORD, UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE

Located on the west coast of Greenland the Icefjord is the sea mouth of Sermeq Kujalleq, one of the few glaciers through which the Greenland ice cap reaches the sea. Sermeq Kujalleq is one of the fastest and most active glaciers in the world. The combination of a huge ice-sheet and the dramatic sounds of a fast-moving glacial ice-stream calving into a fjord covered by icebergs makes for a dramatic and awe-inspiring natural phenomenon.

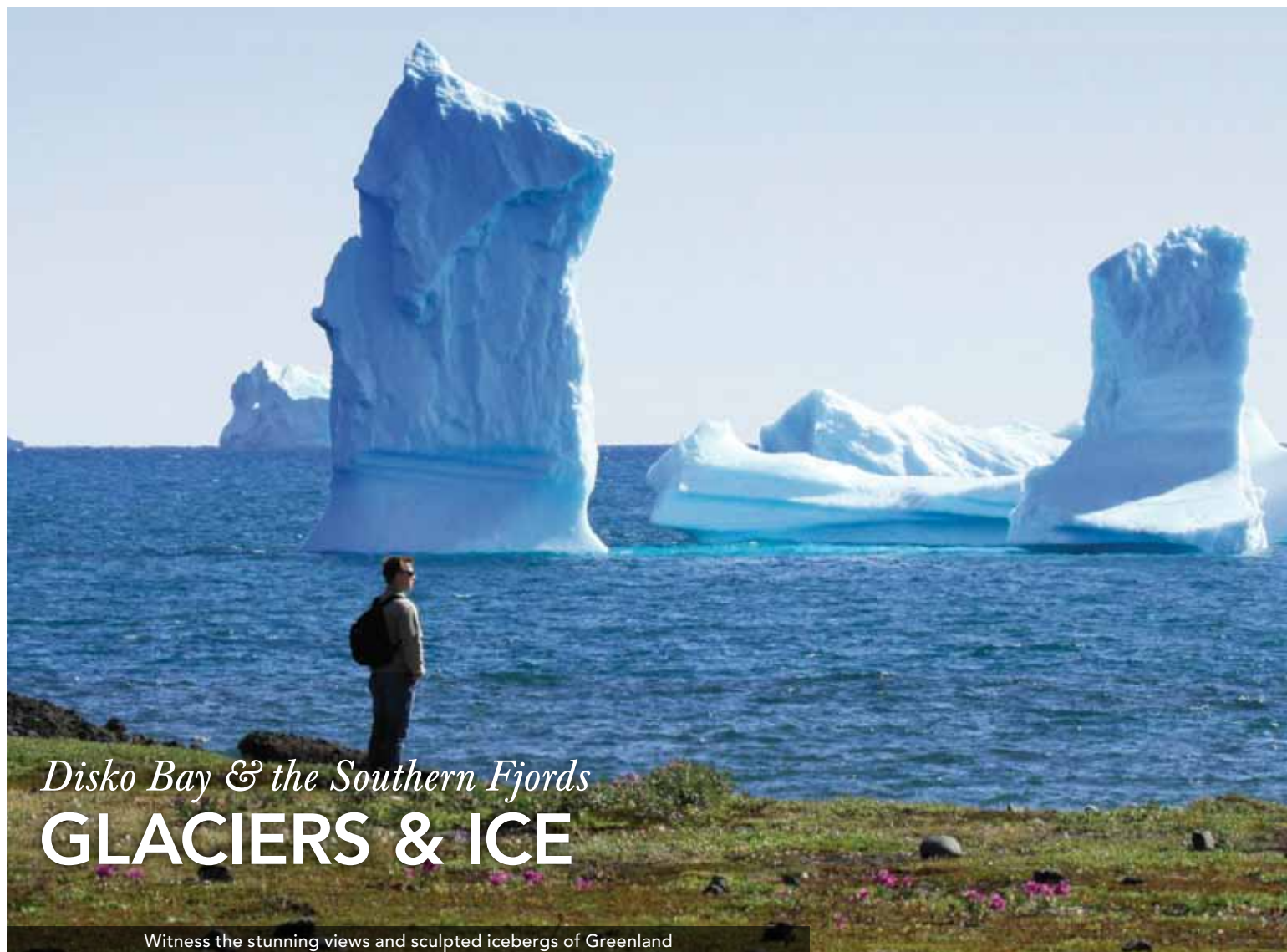

Disko Bay & the Southern Fjords **GLACIERS & ICE**

Witness the stunning views and sculpted icebergs of Greenland

This is a voyage taking you through the highlights of Disko Bay and to the less visited southern parts of Greenland. En route you will visit traditional Inuit settlements and historic places from the Viking era, the capital of Greenland, Nuuk, and the impressive alpine landscape of the south.

VOYAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 Copenhagen/Kangerlussuaq

Join our charter flight in Copenhagen and fly to Kangerlussuaq, the main gateway to Greenland. The town is situated close to the majestic inland ice that covers more than 80% of Greenland.

DAY 2 Qeqertarsuaq

Qeqertarsuaq is situated on the old volcanic island of Disko. Witness the grounded icebergs as you take a stroll along the beach or join the highly-recommended walking tour to Blæsedalen.

DAY 3 Ilulissat

Ilulissat means 'iceberg' in Greenlandic, and this town lives up to its name. The most productive glacier in the Northern Hemisphere, Sermeq Kujalleq, feeds

enormous bergs into the Ilulissat Icefjord. As a result this area is on UNESCO's list of World Heritage sites.

DAY 4 Sisimiut

Sisimiut is the second largest community in Greenland. Here you'll find fishing trawlers, a shipyard and a busy fish processing factory. We recommend a visit to the arts and crafts workshop close to the pier. Here you may watch the local craftsmen create traditional jewellery and purchase local souvenirs.

DAY 5 Nuuk

Nuuk is the capital and the oldest town in Greenland founded by the Norwegian missionary Hans Egede in 1728. Today old and new traditions meet here, from picturesque old buildings in "Kolonihaven" to the modern building of the Greenland Home Rule.

DAY 6 Ivittuut

Ivittuut is an old abandoned mining village, once a production centre of cryolite. In summertime, however, some people return to inhabit the old houses by the sea.

DAY 7 Narsaq and Qassiarsuk

Narsaq is located in a huge complex of fjords. The glaciers close by scatter icebergs into the waters which are rich in seals, salmon, trout and minke whales. Qassiarsuk is known for the nearby settlement of Brattalid which was home to Erik the Red, Greenland's Viking founder in 982.

DAY 8 Hvalsey and Qaqortoq

In Hvalsey some of the best preserved ruins from the Norse period are found including the former 'Austurbyggd' which was abandoned in 1408. From here we continue to Qaqortoq, founded by the

Norwegian trader Anders Olsen in 1775, and today home to 3,400 people.

DAY 9 Prince Christian Sound

This 45 km long channel-like sound is often full of icebergs and its impressive granite rock faces on each side create a spectacular transit.

DAY 10 Denmark Strait

While crossing the Denmark Strait we take the reverse route of the great Norse settlers who left the shores of Iceland and Norway more than 900 years ago to travel to the "Green Land".

DAY 11 Grundarfjörður, Iceland

Grundarfjörður is a fishing village on the Snæfellsnes peninsula. It is also often called "Iceland in a nutshell" because of the diversity of its landscape; lava and rock formations, glaciers and volcanic activity, as well as a wealth of bird life and picturesque scenery.

DAY 12 Reykjavik, Iceland

The world's northernmost capital, Reykjavik is an exciting, vibrant city surrounded by incredible scenery. Here is where your voyage ends.

NATIONAL PARK EXPEDITION

Experience the tranquillity, glaciers and mountains in Alpefjord

Join an extraordinary and exclusive expedition taking you to three Arctic islands; Spitsbergen, Greenland and Iceland. The emphasis is on the rarely visited North East Greenland National Park which is the largest in the world and the least visited with only about 500 visitors every year. This is a special opportunity to experience the Arctic in autumn before winter closes in and makes this corner of the planet uninhabitable for all but the hardest of species.

VOYAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 Longyearbyen and Barentsburg

Longyearbyen is a Norwegian settlement often referred to as the capital of Svalbard. This is a lively small town, situated in a fantastic Arctic landscape. Barentsburg is a Russian settlement with an exotic collection of Russian artefacts and architecture.

DAY 2 Kongsfjorden and North West Spitsbergen National Park

Kings Bay is the largest fjord on the North West coast of Spitsbergen. The landscape varies from large tundra plains to alpine peaks with dramatic glaciers calving into the ocean. At 78° 55' N, Ny Ålesund is the world's northernmost permanently inhabited community, where a

number of countries run their own national research stations. Activity here is particularly high in the summer. When Dutchman Willem Barents first discovered Svalbard in 1596, the name he gave to this new land was 'Spitzbergen' ('Spitz' meaning sharp), reflecting the sharp and steep mountains in the area. Magdalenefjorden is home to a very important piece of cultural heritage; a whaling station from the 16th century, including a graveyard of whalers who died during the first "oil adventure".

DAY 3 Moffen/At Sea

Moffen is a high latitude islet at 80°N with a walrus colony and bird sanctuary. The atoll-like shape of the island made it a perfect safe harbour for any early whalers caught in bad weather.

DAY 4 - 10 North East Greenland National Park, Greenland

We're leaving the warmer waters of the Gulf Stream to enter the cold water current that follows the coast of East Greenland. We will make our way south, within the boundaries of North East Greenland National Park; the largest national park on Earth. The mountains are alpine, the waters are scattered with large icebergs and the valleys are populated with Musk oxen. This voyage will take you to one of the most isolated places on Earth – but aboard one of the most capable specially-built expedition vessels. Our expert guides and lecturers will safely guide you on hikes and small boat trips in addition to briefings and lectures on the places we visit.

DAY 11 Ittoqqortoormiit (Scoresbysund)

Reykjavik is the world's northernmost capital city and referred to locally as the "smallest big city on Earth". In relative close surroundings of the city you may find glaciers, waterfalls, geysers and mountains. Here is where your voyage ends.

Remote, mysterious and extreme, the island of Spitsbergen is the crown of Arctic Norway; a land forged by ice, wind and sea that offers up a spectacular range of unforgettable adventures.

Located right on the southern fringe of the ever frozen Arctic Ocean, where the warmer currents of the Gulf Stream meet the cold air and water from the north, Spitsbergen and the other islands in the Svalbard archipelago are a biological hot spot. Reigning this fragile food web is the polar bear.

Every summer, thousand of seabirds migrate to the coastal cliffs of Svalbard due to its proximity to the feeding grounds. At some places we will see cabins from past times when farmers from Northern Norway headed for Svalbard to seek their fortunes as trappers.

One thing they do have in common is that pioneer, Klondike feeling - places with self-confidence and reliance in their isolation from the mainland.

Iceland, Jan Mayen and Spitsbergen CLIMATE VOYAGE

The Climate Voyage follows the oceanographic traditions of Fridtjof Nansen, the most prominent of Norwegian Explorers. Join us as we make a rare visit to one of the most isolated islands in the world, Jan Mayen, en route to the high Arctic archipelago of Svalbard.

VOYAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 Reykjavik, Iceland

Iceland's capital city, Reykjavik, is the starting point of our 2012 climate pilgrimage. Our route for this particular voyage is Hurtigruten's inaugural homage to the journey the Vikings pioneered more than 800 years ago. We are setting sail for one of the most diverse and isolated islands on Earth, Jan Mayen.

DAY 2 At Sea

As our northbound heading takes us across open sea today, you are welcome to join us for a programme of lectures and observations on seabirds and sea mammals. Our team of experts will also invite you to the lecture halls to learn more about climate change. MS Fram is following the so-called Global Conveyor Belt. This

global superhighway of seawater is immensely important for the global climate and temperature distribution on the planet.

DAY 3 Jan Mayen, Norway

Jan Mayen is a Norwegian territory and one of the most isolated islands in the world. The closest land mass is Iceland some 600 kilometres away. Tourists visiting Jan Mayen are extremely rare, and not many of these are able to land on the shores. MS Fram and the expedition team will do their best to make it possible to set foot on this fascinating outpost as it is sure to be an experience of a lifetime.

DAY 4 At Sea

Once again you are welcome to join our programme of lectures and observation of seabirds and sea mammals. This is the day to remember the experiences from yesterday

and to prepare for the next highlight of the voyage - Spitsbergen. We will learn more about why Spitsbergen is such a strong symbol for climate change and why it is considered a global thermometer.

DAY 5 Longyearbyen, Spitsbergen, Svalbard

Longyearbyen is an Arctic outpost with modern amenities and often referred to as the 'capital of Svalbard'. The University Centre focuses on natural sciences and one of its prestigious projects is to find a viable method of storing CO² in geologic layers underneath the permafrost and to make Longyearbyen climate-neutral.

DAY 6 Ny Ålesund, Spitsbergen, Svalbard

At 78° 55' N, Ny Ålesund is the world's northernmost permanently inhabited community, where a number of countries

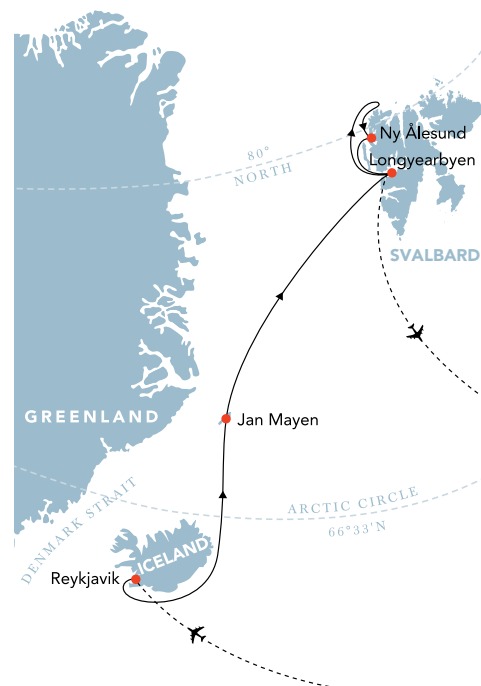

run their own national research stations. Ice and weather permitting we will try to cross the 80th parallel. Keep your eyes open for walrus, whales and polar bears.

DAY 7 Isfjorden, Spitsbergen, Svalbard

Coming into Isfjorden we will again observe giant bird cliffs. Isfjorden is the largest fjord complex in Spitsbergen, almost slicing the island in half. In the afternoon our Expedition Team will search for a fitting bay where we can make our last expedition landing and we will wrap things up with some onboard festivities including the polar barbecue.

Sail along the northwest coast of Spitsbergen, journey through a landscape of breathtaking fjords and gigantic glaciers, all set before a magical backdrop of jagged mountain peaks. VOYAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 Longyearbyen and Barentsburg

Longyearbyen is a Norwegian settlement often referred to as the capital of Svalbard. This is a lively small town, situated in a fantastic Arctic landscape. The history and heritage of coal mining can be seen everywhere. Barentsburg is a Russian settlement with an exotic collection of Russian artefacts and architecture. This "Company town" was built in 1935 around the entrance to the coal mine.

DAY 2 Hornsund

The landscape of Hornsund is largely alpine with the majestic Hornsundtinden mountain soaring highest of all. Let your imagination run wild while spending the day in these extraordinary surroundings.

DAY 3 Bellsund

At 78° 55' N, Ny Ålesund is the world's northernmost permanently inhabited community, where a number of countries run their own national research stations. Activity here is particularly high in the summer. We hope to reach Moffen, a high latitude islet at 80°N with a walrus

colony and bird sanctuary. The atoll-like shape of the island made it a perfect safe harbour for any early whalers caught in bad weather.

DAY 5 Woodfjorden and Liefdefjorden

These large fjords in North Spitsbergen are striking in varied landscape. We will cruise towards the Monaco glacier, passing a number of small islets where eider ducks nest during the summer. If we are lucky we might spot a polar bear searching for eggs.

DAY 6 North West Spitsbergen National Park

Known locally as the North West Corner, this area has a long history of exploration. When Dutchman Willem Barents first found Svalbard in 1596, the name he gave to this new land was 'Spitzbergen' ("Spitz" meaning sharp) reflecting the

DAY 4 North East Spitsbergen Nature Reserve

The spectacular bird cliff of Alkefjellet is sometimes referred to as the Piccadilly Circus of seabirds; its 300 m spires rise directly from the sea and create perfect nesting conditions.

DAY 5 South West Svalbard Nature Reserve

Edgøya is the third largest island in Svalbard. Here you will find cultural heritage from all eras of human exploration of Svalbard. Storfjorden will give us spectacular views of the east coast. In the distance we will see hundreds of glaciers and mountains and if we

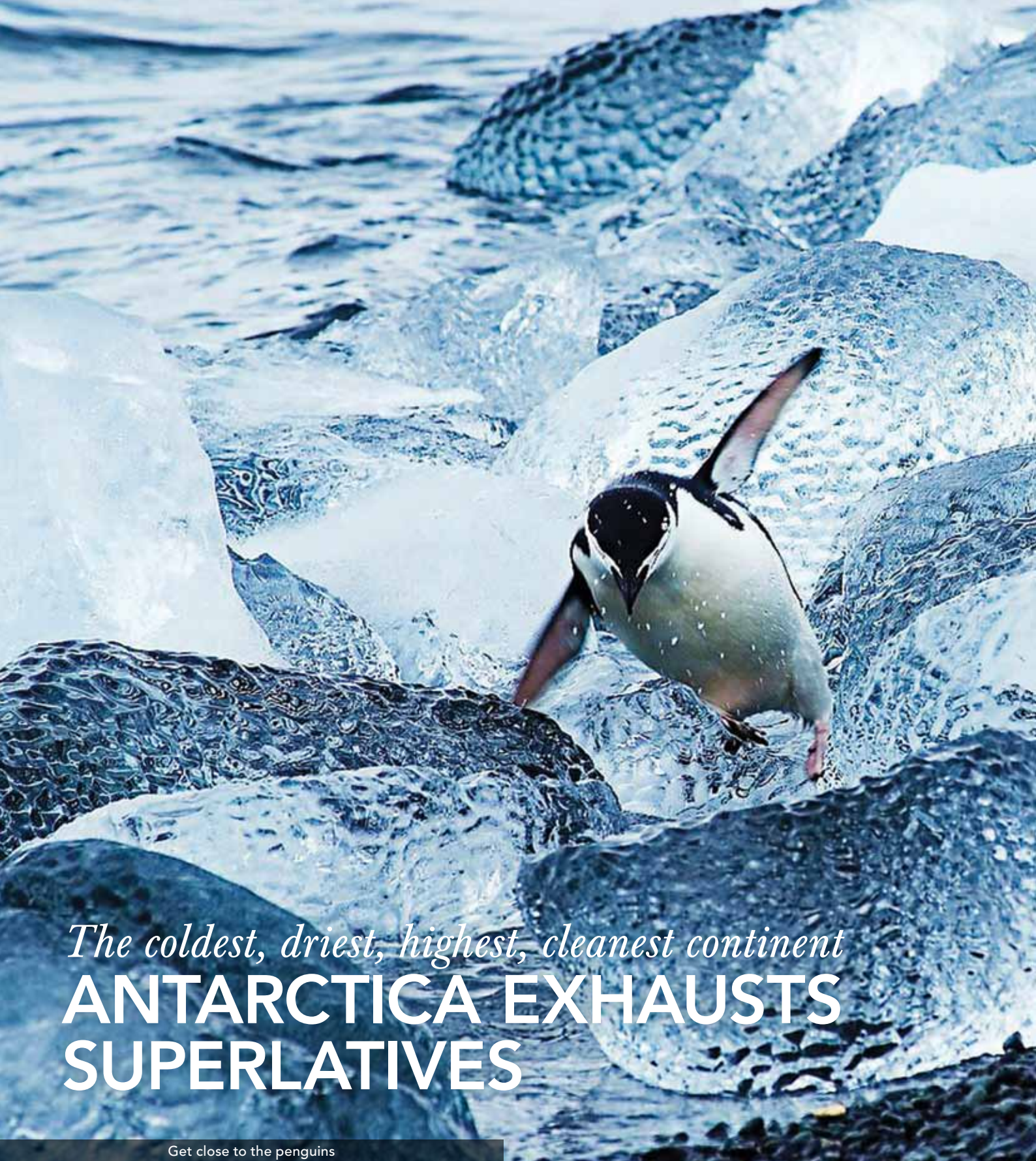

LANDINGS IN ANTARCTICA



Petermann Island

An endless white wilderness, Antarctica is nature at its most sublime and haunting. During these astonishing voyages you will learn of the great explorers who paved the way into these southern oceans, gazing out across landscapes that have remained as awe-inspiring and unchanged as the day that man first set eyes upon them.

Weather, wind, and ice conditions will determine the exact nature of your programme and schedule. Safety is paramount and the ship's captain will decide the final sailing itinerary during the voyage. Therefore every voyage is unique and all advertised routes, by the very

nature of the region, can only be indicative. Below you will find a selection of some of the possible landing sites in Antarctica and during your voyage we will attempt to land at some of these sites.

DECEPTION ISLAND, SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS

One of the highlights of the South Shetlands, Deception Island is a distinctive ring-shaped volcanic caldera, a portion of which has collapsed and created a navigable opening into the flooded interior. The natural harbour within includes Whalers Bay, home to an abandoned whaling station known as Hektor, as well as a derelict British base.

HALF MOON ISLAND, SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS

Staggeringly photogenic and blessed with some of the most spectacular Antarctic scenery imaginable, Half Moon Island is a glittering gem amongst these island treasures. Its serrated and creviced cliffs are home to a large colony of chinstrap penguins, as well as Antarctic terns, kelp gulls, snowy sheathbills, Wilson's storm petrels and several species of seals who are regular visitors to the island.



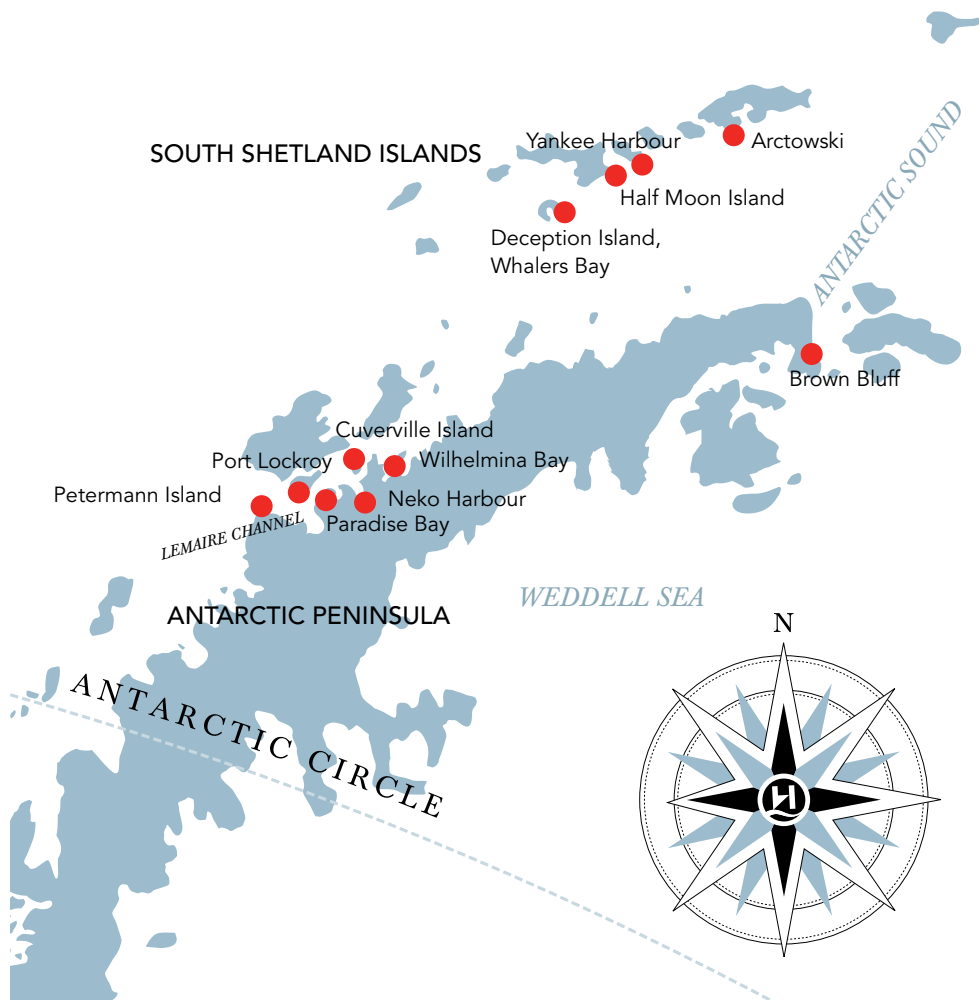

YANKEE HARBOUR, SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS

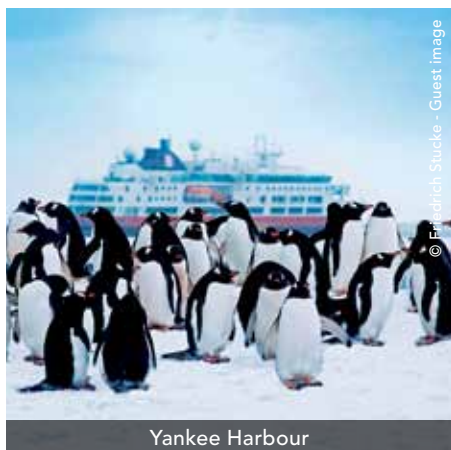
Early sealers in the area used Yankee Harbour on Greenwich Island as a frequent base of operations, its remarkable setting providing a natural safe haven for the sailors. Remnants of those early days can still be seen littering the shoreline, but the big draw for visitors here is the large colony of gentoo penguins, whose numbers are estimated to be around 4,000 breeding pairs.

CUVERVILLE ISLAND

Situated in the scenic Errera Channel, Cuverville Island boasts the largest known colony of gentoo penguins in the Antarctic Peninsula. The narrow Errera Channel offers a spectacular passage to and from Cuverville, as icebergs become trapped and grounded in the nearby shallows. Watching from the observation decks as our navigators weave the ship carefully between the icebergs is as exciting as being surrounded by the throngs of nesting penguins onshore.

NEKO HARBOUR

Neko Harbour, with its gentoo penguin colony and small Argentine refuge hut lies nestled in Andvord Bay, surrounded by the mountains and high glacier walls of the peninsula. Named after a factory whaling ship from the early 1900s, Neko is one of the rare places in the Antarctic Peninsula area where you may land on the Antarctic mainland.

PARADISE BAY

The harbour is paradise not only in name, but in splendour and scenery as well. Protected from the winds of the nearby Gerlache Strait, Paradise Harbour offers another rare opportunity for a mainland landing and some of the finest vistas the Peninsula has to offer. Here you can find the Argentine base Almirante Brown and the Chilean base Gonzalez Videla, as well as colonies of neighbouring penguins.

LEMAIRE CHANNEL

This 11 km long and 1.6km wide channel is one of the most beautiful passages in Antarctica. It bestows upon the traveller a glimpse into what fascinates us most about this incredible environment; it is at once sublime and imposing, delicate and daunting, inviting and inhospitable.

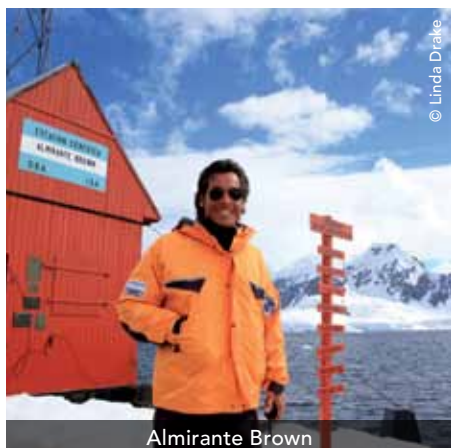
PETERMANN ISLAND

Its location in the picturesque Penola Strait

makes Petermann Island a great spot for iceberg and whale spotting and offers spectacular views across the channel to the Antarctic Peninsula.

PORT LOCKROY

The British base on Goudier Island in Port Lockroy was built in 1941 and abandoned in 1962, it lay empty until 1996 when it was refurbished as a museum by the Antarctic Heritage Trust. It has since become one of

the most popular sites in Antarctica and offers a unique peek into life in an Antarctic base in the 1950s.

WILHELMINA BAY

The mountains and high glaciers around Wilhelmina Bay ensure plenty of dramatic scenery and sculpted ice from tiny floating pieces to large icebergs. The bay is a choice feeding ground for whales and seals and therefore was a rich hunting ground for the whalers of the past.

ANTARCTIC SOUND

The huge ice shelves of the Antarctic continent give birth to mile-long tabular icebergs. The strong currents of the Weddell Sea conspire to bring these massive flat-topped bergs north into the Antarctic Sound at the northeastern end of the Antarctic Peninsula.

BROWN BLUFF

Brown Bluff lies on the coast of the Antarctic Sound, at the tip of the Antarctic Peninsula. As the name suggests, the landscape is dominated by an ominous 745 metres high cliff. The towering, rust-coloured bluff is volcanic in origin and the beach is peppered with lava "bombs". Adélie penguins, gentoo penguins, kelp gulls, and cape petrels can be found breeding here and Weddell seals are also regular visitors.

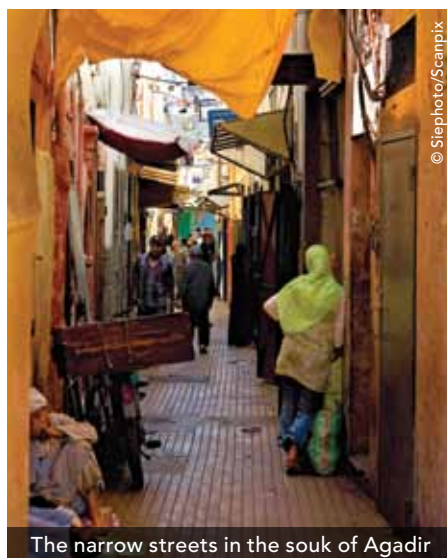

This main leg of MS Fram's repositioning odyssey sees it leave Las Palmas in the Canary Islands on day one; reappearing on Buenos Aires' horizon 19 days later. During this incredible crossing the emphasis is truly on relaxation and enjoying the feeling of being surrounded by the ocean.

VOYAGE ITINERARY

DAY 1 Las Palmas, Gran Canaria (Canary Islands)

Our voyage starts in Gran Canaria, the third largest of the Canary Islands. Its nickname, the "Miniature Continent" stems from the number of different climates and variety of landscapes that can be found. The island itself is under protection as a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO. Most of the tourists who visit go to the southern part of the island which is sunnier and drier than the north. 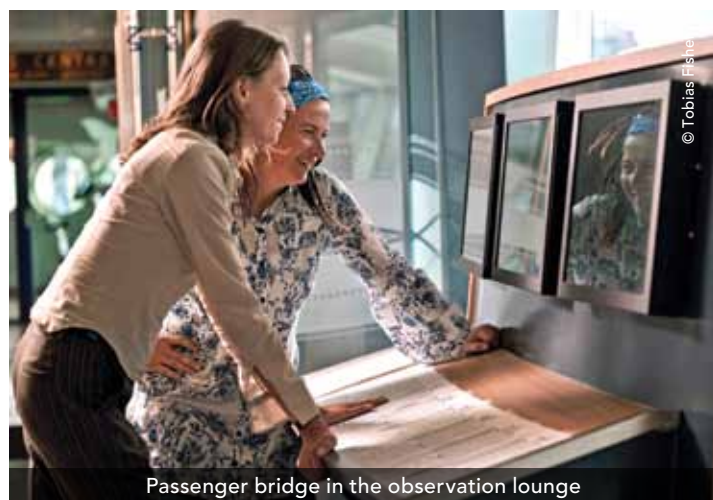

LIFE ON BOARD

No dressing up for dinner – no fuss, no frenzy – our aim is to sail calmly through the crisp clean air, close to the ever-changing environment.

CRUISE CARD

A cruise card will be issued on arrival on board as part of the check in procedure in accordance with ISPS regulations. All our guests are requested to wear this card when disembarking in all ports of call and landings. The card serves as a control system on the gangway enabling the ship to know which of our guests are on board and ashore at any time. This card, in addition to being the key card for your cabin, is also to be activated as your payment card on board. The card is the only means of payment for the on board facilities. To activate the cruise card account you must have a Visa or Mastercard. Please note that when using your credit card on board the ship, your account will be debited in NOK. The rate of exchange will be the one validated by your credit card company. Indicative rates are given on board, but these are not fixed. The evening before the voyage ends the account will be added up to be settled on board and a receipt brought to your cabin. We regret that there is no facility for cash withdrawals or currency exchange on board.

CUISINE

The open seating for the breakfast and lunch buffet creates a relaxed atmosphere in which to contemplate the sights already seen and anticipate those still to come. Where possible, we plan our menus around seasonal ingredients, taking advantage of local produce to satisfy healthy appetites stimulated by the fresh

sea air. The restaurant is licensed and the daily three-course set dinner at your reserved table becomes an occasion to exchange the stories of the day before enjoying a coffee in one of the lounges or perhaps something stronger in the bar.

ON BOARD PRICES

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

The following general information for all clients travelling with Hurtigruten, together with the information on pages 62–73 forms part of our booking conditions.

ADDRESS AND CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THE SHIP

All cabins on MS Fram are equipped with a telephone. In order to call from the ship you must purchase a card at the reception desk. If you wish to call to the ship simply dial the number below. There is an Internet café on board (at extra cost) and Wi-Fi is available on deck 4 in the reception area. There is no connection available in the cabins/suites. Please note that the connection is a 512MB line and that both internet and telephones from time to time will be out of range due to the vessel's location.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Guests are respectfully reminded that only beverages bought from the ships' restaurant(s) and bar(s) can be consumed on board. Alcoholic beverages purchased in ports-of-call and from our on-board shops will be stored by the ship and delivered to your cabin on the last day of the sailing. According to Norwegian law, you must be over the age of 18 to purchase beer and wine and over the age of 20 to buy spirits.

BEFORE YOU GO

Passport and Visas

All passengers must have a valid passport (some itineraries require passports to be valid for another three to six months after your return date, all passengers need to check with the relevant embassy/consulate/travel agent for passport validity and visas). If you are travelling to St. Petersburg on our Baltic Sea voyage you will not need to bring your own visa to take part in the ship's shore excursions. If however you are planning individual shore visits in St. Petersburg you need to have a visa with you.

It is essential that the family and first names on the passport match those on your travel documents exactly.

At check-in passports will be collected by the crew on board the vessel, in order to clear immigrations and customs. Passports will be kept throughout the whole voyage and returned at the end of the trip. Please bring a photocopy of the passport with you.

Health

Passengers suffering from any known or suspected medical condition, or women more than 28 weeks pregnant, are required to notify us at least 14 days before departure and produce a medical certificate confirming fitness to travel. We reserve the right to refuse or cancel a booking if the relevant certificate is not produced and will not be liable for the refusal by any operator to carry any person who has failed to notify us as above. If in doubt about health precautions, please consult your doctor. In accordance with IAATO requirements, all travellers to Antarctica must complete a confidential medical declaration form, signed

by a doctor stating that they are fit to travel.

The form will be sent to you 3 months before departure and you will need to bring it with you for the voyage. Passengers taking part in the Trans-Atlantic Crossing will also need to bring this form on board.

Hurtigruten Ltd cannot be held responsible for any circumstances arising out of a failure to disclose a disability or pre-existing medical condition. If you have any concerns regarding reports that long periods of immobility, such as remaining seated during flights, may be a contributory factor of Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT) we recommend you contact your GP for advice. The above information is correct at the time of going to press but it is the responsibility of all passengers to ensure they comply with health, passport and visa requirements applicable at time of travel.

CHANGES TO THE ITINERARY & EXCURSIONS

All routes and excursions are provisional and subject to change – weather, sea and ice conditions may affect the itinerary. Excursions may also be subject to minimum/maximum numbers. The operator reserves the right to change the contents of excursions without prior notice.

CHILDREN

Hurtigruten ASA cannot accept children under the age of 5 to travel with us to Antarctica. There is no age restriction to our suitability for other destinations. For safety reasons, children under 12 years of age will be considered on each landing. It is entirely at the captain's discretion to allow children on shore landings.

CORRESPONDENCE

When you or your agent contact us we will usually confirm your holiday at the earliest opportunity and advise current flight times, prices, including any applicable supplements or extras, etc. For high season dates, when demand is greater, or if you book within eight weeks of departure, we may have to request your cabin, flight or hotel space and it may take slightly longer to confirm your holiday. An invoice will be sent to confirm your arrangements. If you are travelling with friends but would each like to receive separate documents please advise us at the time of booking.

DISABLED CABINS

The ship is suitable for wheel-chairs. Heavily disabled persons or persons in need of special assistance must travel with a companion. For further information, please ask your travel agency. Please note that the ship's gangway must be used in order to embark/disembark wheelchairs. In ports where tidal conditions or other circumstances require use of a portable gangway, or during landings with Polarcirkel boats, there is no possibility to use/take wheelchairs.

ELECTRICITY

The plugs in your cabins are all 220V/50hz.

ENVIRONMENT

All waste is stored on board until it is deposited for treatment ashore. We never throw waste in the sea and we ask you not to leave any when you are on shore excursions. In populated areas there are containers for depositing litter, please use them. We ask you to respect the saying: "Leave nothing but footprints, take nothing but pictures."

GENERAL

Brochure Accuracy

The information and descriptions contained in this brochure have been checked by our staff and/or local agents to ensure they are correct. However, changes may occur after the date of publication and there may be occasions when Hurtigruten or local suppliers may withdraw some facilities. Should we become aware of any significant change which may be considered to have an effect on the enjoyment of your holiday we will do our utmost to advise you. Public holidays and religious festivals may also affect the availability of resort and hotel facilities. Tourist offices can provide details of such events.

Some areas we visit are very remote, affected by prolonged cold weather or difficult terrain. Provision of facilities will be subject to local conditions, and customs and lifestyles may differ from those to which you are accustomed.

Tour Arrangements

The voyages and tours in this brochure are based on independent travel, however MS Fram and many of our featured hotels have information staff who will advise you on excursions and offer general assistance.

Wildlife

The brochure includes pictures and descriptions of wildlife which may be seen from the ships and during excursions, but there is no guarantee of sightings.

GRATUITY POLICY

Hurtigruten ASA have learned that many of our guests wish to give a special thanks to our service crew on board. It is at your discretion to honour service rendered by the crew in bars, restaurant and cabins. In order to give you some guidelines, we recommend 75 NOK (approx. 8 GBP, 10 Euro, 12 USD) per passenger per day as an average gratuity. Whatever amount you have decided to give, please fill in the form you will find in your cabin and give it to the purser two nights before the end of the cruise. The amount will then be debited to your cruise account.

LAUNDRY

Laundry service is available on board for a small fee. No dry-cleaning is possible.

LECTURERS

The ship's experienced lecturers/guides command an in-depth knowledge of the areas we sail in. They will conduct, on a

regular basis, lectures on topics such as biology, history and geology throughout the course of the trip. The lecturing schedule will be announced every day in the on board daily programme. Do not hesitate to contact our Expedition Team for any questions or concerns you might have.

LIFE SAVING EQUIPMENT, LIFE VESTS AND SAFETY ON BOARD

MS Fram complies with all safety requirements and is classified as a polar vessel suitable for sailing in icy waters. On arrival on board all passengers will be instructed in safety procedures and the use and location of the safety equipment. There is a safety plan situated on the inside of the cabin door. We stress the importance of becoming acquainted with the safety plan. Special safety regulations will apply on landings with the Polarcirkel boats. Please follow the instructions given by the expedition leader and crew/staff. Special lifejackets for use during landings will be handed out to all passengers upon arrival. This will be yours for the whole voyage, so please make sure that it fits you properly, and bring it to all landings.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES AND MEDICATION

There is an English-speaking doctor and nurse on board at all times. The ship has a small hospital with the necessary equipment and drugs to handle small emergencies. In the event of a serious emergency, the nearest hospital will be contacted. Medical consultations as well as medicines must be charged the passenger affected. The price for a consultation is approx. 285 NOK. Customers on medication must remember to bring sufficient supplies to last through any unforeseen delays. We also recommend that you keep your medication in your hand luggage properly labelled and with clear instructions for its use. If you depend on vital drugs, please inform the ship's doctor. Illness on board can lead to quarantine and orders from ship's doctor and captain must be followed. All guests must have travel/health insurance.

MINIMUM NUMBERS

Some holidays are subject to a minimum number of participants to enable them to take place. Should the minimum not be reached we will advise you at least 8 weeks prior to your

departure, when we reserve the right to cancel the holiday and refund all monies paid to us. Alternatively, you may choose another holiday with us but if the alternative arrangement is at an additional cost, the difference will be payable by you.

MOBILE PHONE

Depending on the carrier company with whom you have a contract, mobile phones will function in some places on shore. Check with your carrier company for details. Guests may use their own GSM telephones on board the ship at all times at an international price level. The price will vary depending on which mobile operator you use. Please check with your carrier company for rates and if your subscription is valid on the MCP Satellite System on board.

MOBILITY

We regret that Hurtigruten Explorer holidays are not considered suitable for less mobile passengers as landings and sometimes embarkation are by Polarcirkel boats or tenders. A certain level of agility will be required to board but crew will be in attendance to ensure passenger safety.

POST

You can hand in your mail in the reception for a limited amount covering service fee and stamps. We will forward the post in every port where it's possible. Please be prepared for your postcard to take some time before it arrives! Hurtigruten can not accept responsibility for lost mail.

RESTAURANT SERVICES

On board we serve a buffet breakfast and lunch. Dinner varies between buffets, set meals and barbecues. The type of dinner is announced in the daily programme. Our head waiter on MS Fram will assign tables prior to arrival. Table numbers and meal times will be in your cabin upon arrival.

If you have special dietary requirements, such as vegetarian, diabetic or gluten free, please inform your sales office/travel agent as early as possible and contact the head waiter when on board. The chefs will do their best to meet your dietary requirements. Beer, wine and soft drinks are sold in the restaurant during lunch and dinner.

ROOM SERVICE

The cabins are cleaned daily. We regret that meals or drinks cannot be served in the cabins.

SEASICKNESS

Seasickness pills are available in the reception at a low cost. If you are prone to seasickness it is recommended that you bring pills that you are familiar with. You may also buy "sea bands" on board.

SMOKING

On board MS Fram smoking is only permitted in designated areas on outside decks. Please do not smoke in your cabin. To show respect for the environment, please use the provided ashtrays when smoking. Throwing cigarette ends overboard is strictly prohibited.

SPECIAL DIETS

Please see Restaurant Services section on this page.

SPECIAL REQUESTS

If you have any special requests (e.g. dietary or medical), please inform us at the time of booking. We will do our best to meet such requests but cannot guarantee to do so and in no circumstances will any such request be accepted by us so as to form part of our contractual agreement.

STABILISERS

MS Fram has stabilisers.

WATER

The water on board is drinkable but we recommend buying bottled water.

WEATHER CONDITIONS

The planned itinerary may change and landings may be cancelled due to changeable weather conditions. Hurtigruten ASA reserves the right to change the itinerary due to weather conditions and other unforeseen events.

WELCOME MEETING

Upon arrival on board, there will be a mandatory passenger drill, followed by a welcome meeting where security information as well as practical information about the cruise will be given.

FLIGHTS

AIRLINES AND AIRCRAFT

Our airline partners include Scandinavian Airlines, SAS Braathens, Norwegian, KLM Royal Dutch Airlines, Air France, Iberia and Air Greenland. The aircraft used on the different routes will be Boeing 737 & 757, Airbus 320/330 or similar.

IN FLIGHT MEAL SERVICE AND FLIGHT UPGRADES

There is no complimentary meal served in economy class on domestic and international routes within Europe for airlines listed in this brochures (except KLM), snacks and refreshments can be purchased on board. A complimentary meal with refreshments is served in business class within Europe and on intercontinental flights, including Greenland.

Upgrading to business class gives access to benefits such as access to the airline lounge, extra luggage allowance and extra legroom. These vary by airline and route, please ask us for details.

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE

The baggage allowance for most airlines is 20 kg (44 lbs) per person. Regulations vary on low-cost airlines (Norwegian and Easyjet), please check with the airline. In addition each person is permitted to take one piece of hand luggage, subject to weight limits depending on the airline.

Please advise us at the time of booking if you wish to carry bulky items such as wheelchairs to enable us to clear this with the airline. Carriage of those and similar items cannot be guaranteed and maybe subject to a charge. If you exceed the baggage allowance, carriage of excess luggage may be refused or an excess charge may be made by the airline.

BOOKING CONDITIONS

These are the terms and conditions which apply to your holiday and/or sea passage; please read them and the information on pages 62 to 69 carefully as you will be bound by them.

1. YOUR CONTRACT

Your contract is with Hurtigruten Ltd., a company wholly owned by Hurtigruten ASA, on the basis of these conditions and the information contained in the brochure, and shall be governed by English law and the jurisdiction of the English Courts. You may however choose the law and jurisdiction of Scotland or Northern Ireland if you wish to do so. When you book an air package holiday or sailing with us the contract between us will exist as soon as you or your travel agent asks us to confirm your booking. We then become responsible to provide you with the voyage arrangements or air package holiday you have booked and you become responsible to pay for them, in each case subject to these terms and conditions. You will also become responsible to pay for any additional arrangements made by us on your behalf for including International Flights not included in any air package, optional excursions, travel insurance or other arrangements requested by you and booked.

When you make a booking you guarantee you have the authority to accept and do accept on behalf of your party the terms of these booking conditions and accept responsibility for making all payments to us for all members of the party. We are unable to accept provisional or conditional bookings. We will send all documents and other information to you and you will be responsible for ensuring that all other members of the party are kept fully informed. A confirmation invoice which you should check as soon as you receive it will be sent on receipt of your deposit. If you wish to change or cancel any arrangements later you may have to pay an amendment or cancellation charge and additional costs (see below) which may be as much as the whole of the original price of your arrangements.

Only one invoice and one set of documents will be issued. No verbal amendments may be made by either party to these written booking conditions; any change must be in writing signed by the Chief Executive of Hurtigruten ASA.

If you book your holiday through a travel agent all communication must be through that agent. Please quote your booking reference number in all communications. All monies you pay to the travel agent are held by the travel agent on our behalf at all times.

You are responsible for complying with any Visa or other entry requirements for you or any of your party who are not full European Union Passport Holders.

2. PAYMENT

Once you have asked us to confirm your booking the total price of the arrangements you have booked is due and is payable as follows:

(i) If you book more than 8 weeks before your scheduled departure date a non-refundable deposit of 20%.

The balance is due 8 weeks before your scheduled departure date. No second invoice will be sent. Travel documents will be issued 7 to 14 days prior to departure.

(ii) If you book less than 8 weeks before your scheduled departure date the full price is payable when you book. Our preferred method of deposit payment is by bank debit card or credit card. Balance payment may be made by cash, bank debit card, credit card or cheque (providing there is time to clear it to meet the payment schedule shown above – you should allow 5 working days for clearance from the time we receive it).

Online Bookings

Bookings made online that cost less than EUR 970 or made within 8 weeks of departure require full payment at the time of booking and no refund is made if cancelled.

Credit Card Charges

No charge will be made for deposits or balances paid by Debit Card/Switch/Delta. In line with most major operators we will make a charge of 2% for deposits and balances paid by credit card. Your booking may be cancelled if you do not make payment on time (we will not normally send reminders) and cancellation charges as set out under "If You Cancel" (see below) will be payable by you.

3.A PRICES

All Voyage prices shown in this brochure are in euros and are per person based on full occupancy of the cabin accommodation unless otherwise stated. Single/Sole occupancy of cabins with more than one berth is at our discretion as single/sole use of multiple berth cabins will be limited. The price of your voyage or air package holiday arrangements was calculated using exchange rates quoted in the Financial Times Guide to World Currencies on 01.05.2011, Norwegian Kroner (NOK) 8.75; Euros 1.25 We reserve the right to change any of the prices quoted in this brochure although there will be no change within 30 days of your departure date. You will be advised of the current price of the Voyage or air package holiday you wish to book before your contract is confirmed. We reserve the right to increase or decrease prices in line with any change in VAT, local and UK taxes, embarkation/disembarkation fees, fuel surcharges, exchange rates, security charges or any fees chargeable for the services included in the cost of your holiday. Should it be necessary to make any surcharges we will notify you of the relevant adjustments by issuing a new invoice. In any event we will absorb all such increases where they form less than 2% of the total cost of your voyage or air package holiday (excluding any cancellation or amendment charges). Only amounts in excess of 2% will be invoiced to you, together with an administration charge of EUR 1 per person together with an amount to cover agent's commission.

In the event that any surcharge means you paying in excess of 10% more on the original cost of your voyage or air package holiday, you will be entitled to cancel your trip with a full refund of all monies paid (except amendment fees). Should you wish to cancel under these circumstances you must exercise your right to do so within 14 days from the date of the invoice we send you showing the increase.

Should the price of your voyage or air package holiday go down due to changes above by more than 2% of your holiday cost then any refund due will be paid to you. Please note that travel arrangements are not always purchased in local currency and some apparent changes have no impact on the price of your travel due to contractual or other protection in place.

3.B VOYAGE AND AIR PACKAGE HOLIDAY PRICES DO NOT INCLUDE

- Travel Insurance
- Luggage Handling
- International Flights except where included in the Air Package Holiday Price
- Optional Excursions
- Gratuities

Optional Excursions booked before you travel or local excursions or other activities that you may choose to book and pay for whilst on holiday are not part of your voyage or air package holiday arrangements provided by us nor are we agents for the provider of the service. For any excursion or other activity you book before departure or which you are assisted in arranging whilst on holiday, your contract will solely be with the supplier of the excursion or activity and not with Hurtigruten. We are not responsible for the provision of your excursion or activity or for anything that happens during the course of its provision by the supplier.

4. IF YOU CHANGE YOUR BOOKING

If you wish to change your travel arrangements after they have been confirmed we will do our utmost to help but it may not always be possible. Any request for changes to be made must be in writing by the person who made the booking or your travel agent. You will be asked to pay an administration charge of EUR 50 per person and any further cost we incur in making this alteration. Costs may increase the closer to the departure date that changes are made. For example, the transfer within 56 days of departure of arrangements involving a scheduled flight will mean the cancellation and re-booking of this flight and a significant additional charge.

If you change the number of people in your party, the price of the arrangements will be recalculated for the new party size e.g. this may mean that accommodation is under-occupied and each member of the party may have to pay an increased price.

Any increase in price caused by changes you have requested is not a cancellation charge even though it may arise because a member of your party has cancelled. Any change by you to your confirmed arrangements after departure is in all cases subject to availability and any relevant costs.

5. IF YOU CANCEL

You, or any member of your party, may cancel your travel arrangements at any time. Written notification from the person who made the booking or your travel agent must be received at our offices. We recommend 'Recorded Delivery'. Cancellation takes effect the day we

receive your letter or email. Since we incur costs in relation to your arrangements from the time we confirm your booking you will have to pay the applicable cancellation charges as shown in the table below (which also applies if we cancel because you have failed to make payments on time - see "Payment" section) together with the cost of any air fare for which we have had to pay at the time of the booking and will be payable immediately on cancellation.

If you have to cancel for a reason covered by your travel insurance you may be able to reclaim the cancellation charges, less applicable excess. Insurance premiums are not refundable.

6. IF WE CHANGE OR CANCEL YOUR BOOKING

We reserve the right to change any of the details, and correct any errors in this brochure or invoices at any time. If changes are made before you have made your booking we will advise you before we confirm your arrangements. We reserve the right in any circumstances to cancel your travel arrangements (for example if a minimum number of participants for a particular travel arrangement is not reached, we may have to cancel it) and to change airline, aircraft types, vessels and itineraries without liability for any subsequent loss. Even after we have confirmed your booking we may have to make alterations but we will not cancel your travel arrangements less than 8 weeks before your departure except for reasons of force majeure or failure by you to pay the final balance in full.

Most alterations will be minor and while we will do our best to notify you or your travel agent of any changes as soon as reasonably possible if there is time before your departure, we will have no other liability to you.

Occasionally we may have to make a significant change to your confirmed arrangements.

If we have to make a significant change we will notify you as soon as possible and you may either:

- (a) accept the change and the contract between us will then be varied to incorporate the change; or
- (b) take alternative arrangements altogether (subject to availability). If the alternative arrangements selected are a lower price than those originally confirmed the difference will (if already paid) be refunded to you.
- (c) withdraw from the booking completely in which case we will as soon as possible, refund all money paid to us.

Passengers must give notice of their decision as soon as reasonably possible and not later than 7 days of being informed of the alteration.

If you choose (a) or (b) above, you will receive as compensation a credit towards the cost of your arrangements, or any alternative selected, the amount shown in Scale A below. If you choose (c) we will pay you compensation shown in Scale B below. In all cases we will have no liability for any other or greater compensation or for expenses or losses incurred.

*The compensation shown above applies to full fare paying adults only. Children or others travelling at concessionary rates will receive compensation pro rata based on the concessionary price against the full adult price as shown on the confirmation.

The above rates do not apply when we are forced to make changes which cause you to withdraw or cancel your arrangements, by reason of unusual and unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control and which we could not have avoided by the exercise of all due care and our only liability will be to refund, as soon as possible, all money paid to us by you. We are unable to accept liability or pay compensation where the performance or prompt performance of our contractual obligation is prevented or affected by reason of circumstances amounting to "force majeure" i.e. any event which we or the supplier(s) of the service(s) could not, even with due care foresee or avoid. Such events may include, but are not limited to war, threat of war or civil commotions, riots, terrorist activity, industrial dispute, natural or nuclear disaster, adverse weather, fire, flood, drought, government action, airport and port regulations and closures, technical transportation problems, maintenance to vessels, scheduling of transport and similar events outside our control.

A flight or ship delay does not constitute a change to holiday arrangements.

7. COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

If you have a problem during your holiday concerning any service we have confirmed you must inform the local supplier, e.g. your hotelier, or our local representative or agent immediately to enable them to try to resolve the matter. You are also obliged to act in a way so as to minimise any loss. If the issue is not resolved locally it is essential you notify our head office in writing, quoting the booking reference number, at the earliest opportunity and no later than 28 days after your return, to enable any complaint to be investigated. It is strongly recommended that you communicate any complaint to the supplier of the services in question without delay and obtain a written report. If you fail to follow this procedure we will have been deprived of the opportunity to investigate and rectify your complaint at the time and this may affect your rights under this contract. Any accident resulting in personal injury, loss of, or damage to luggage must be reported to a ship's officer or airline official immediately and written confirmation obtained. We are unable to accept liability for the contents of literature, DVDs, videos or websites produced by our suppliers/hoteliers.

8. OUR LIABILITY TO YOU

We accept liability for any damage caused to you or any person in your party by the failure to perform, or the improper performance of, the voyage or air package holiday arrangements when your booking is confirmed (subject to any changes subsequently agreed between us) (but excluding any additional arrangements or extras whether or not purchased at the same time as defined in paragraph 4B) unless:

- (a) the failures which occur in the performance of the contract are attributable to you or some other person in your party;
- (b) such failures in performance are attributable to a third party unconnected with the provision of the services contracted for and are unforeseeable and unavoidable or;
- (c) such failures are due to:
 - (i) unusual or unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all due care had been exercised; or
 - (ii) an event which we, or the supplier of the services could not foresee or forestall even with all due care.

Our liability, shall in any event be limited to:

- i) the maximum of twice the cost of your travel arrangements, or
- ii) the minimum amount payable in accordance with and/or in an identical manner to:
 - (a) the contractual terms of the companies that provide the transportation and accommodation for your travel arrangements, which are expressly incorporated into the contract and also form the terms and conditions of separate contracts between you and the carrier.
 - (b) any relevant international conventions, including the Warsaw Convention 1929, whether as amended by the Hague Protocol 1955 or the Montreal Protocol 1999, or otherwise, or the Montreal Convention 1999. Carriage of passengers and their luggage by sea is governed by the Athens Convention 1974, and in respect of carriage by rail by the Berne Convention and in respect of provision of accommodation by the Paris Convention. Any action arising out of carriage by air or sea must be commenced within the two year time limit prescribed by the Warsaw and Montreal Conventions or the Athens Convention as applicable. Legal proceedings for all claims for which time bars are not stated in international conventions or are stated in the Norwegian Maritime Code must be made within one year from the date on which disembarkation did, or should have, taken place. The transport of passengers, baggage and vehicles is subject to the provisions of the Act. no. 39 of 24 June 1994 Norwegian Maritime Code, as amended, ("Norwegian Maritime Code") and package tours are subject to the provisions of the Act no. 57 of 25 August 1995 Relating to Package Tours ("The Package Tours Act").

We are to be regarded as having all benefit of any limitation of compensation contained in these, or any other conventions, including claims for death, injury, delay to passengers and loss, damage and delay to luggage. You may ask for copies of the transport companies' contractual terms or the international conventions from our offices at 3, Shortlands, London, W6 8NE.

Under EU law (Regulation 261/2004) you have rights in some circumstances to refunds and/or compensation from your airline in cases of denied boarding, cancellation or delay to flights, for which you must pursue the airline. Reimbursement in such cases will not automatically entitle you to a

refund of any part of your holiday cost from us. Also, where a delay may result in entitlement to cancel a flight this does not automatically entitle you to cancel or receive a refund for any other arrangements, even though they may have been made in conjunction with your flight. If your airline does not comply with the Regulation you should complain to the Air Transport User's Council on 020 7240 6061/www.auc.org.uk.

9. INDEMNITY

When you book arrangements with us you accept responsibility for the proper conduct of yourself and your party. If your actions or omissions cause damage to any property in the provision of the contracted arrangements, or cause delay or diversion to any flight or other means of transportation, you agree to fully indemnify us against any claim (including professional fees and legal costs) made against us by or on behalf of the owner of such property or the operator of the flight or other means of transportation. The Captain of an aircraft or Master of a ship has authority over the aircraft/ship and passengers at all times when they are boarding or on board. There will be no liability on our part, or that of any supplier, for any refund, compensation, or costs thus incurred. Additionally, we will have the right to recover full costs resulting from the incident from the passenger.

At any port or place we may refuse to embark or may disembark any passenger who, in the opinion of the ship's authorized personnel, might be excluded from landing at further destinations by local authorities or who may be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or whose presence may be detrimental to the wellbeing of passengers or crew. In cases of quarantine of the ship, or individual passengers (passengers may be required to remain in their cabin or as instructed by authorised personnel on board if they or any other occupant of the accommodation presents any symptoms or may be considered to put other passengers at risk) we will not be liable for expenses thus caused and in such cases as above there will be no entitlement to any refund or compensation and we will have no liability for costs incurred as a result.

Each passenger warrants that they are fit to travel. Hurtigruten reserves the right to require any passenger to produce evidence of the same and cannot accept liability for any situation arising out of a failure to disclose any pre-existing condition or disability. Passengers with physical or mental disabilities or other conditions which may require special assistance, e.g. use of a wheelchair or scooter, or service animal, must advise us in writing before a booking is made. Passengers who use wheelchairs or who may require special assistance must be accompanied by someone who is able to assist them on shore and at sea.

Your specific passport and visa requirements and other immigration requirements are your responsibility and you should confirm these with the relevant Embassies and/or Consulates. We do not accept responsibility if you cannot travel because you have not complied with the latest requirements. If you have made independent travel arrangements you accept responsibility for joining the ship in good time, regardless of any change to the sailing time or date, or to the itinerary. We are not able to refund monies paid to us, or any third party acting on our or your behalf, or make compensation or other payments where, for whatever reason, you fail to join the ship. Passengers going ashore are responsible for re-boarding the ship prior to departure from port.

10. INSURANCE

It is a condition of the contract with us that every member of the booking has travel insurance in

force for the entire duration of the holiday, covering at least the cancellation of the booking and providing medical cover for illness or injury and repatriation while overseas. Please provide us with the name of your insurer, together with your 24-hour emergency number when you book or as soon as possible.

11. BROCHURE VALIDITY

This brochure was published in June 2011 and the details and prices contained in it are valid from November 2012 to February 2013 but may be superseded by subsequent brochures.

12. DATA PROTECTION

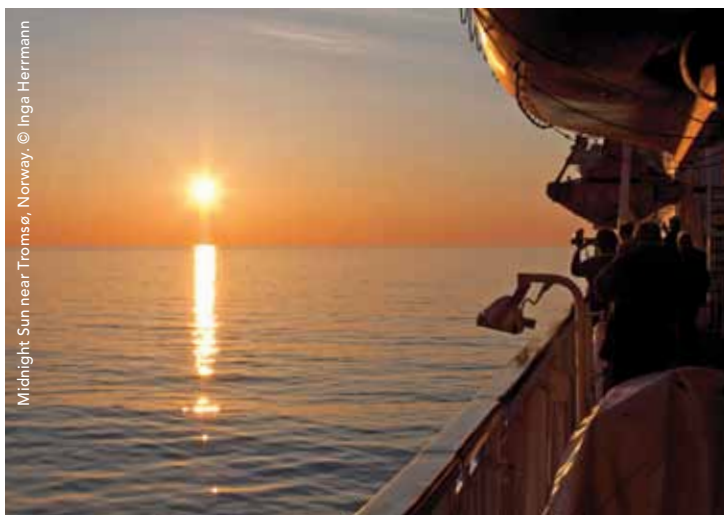

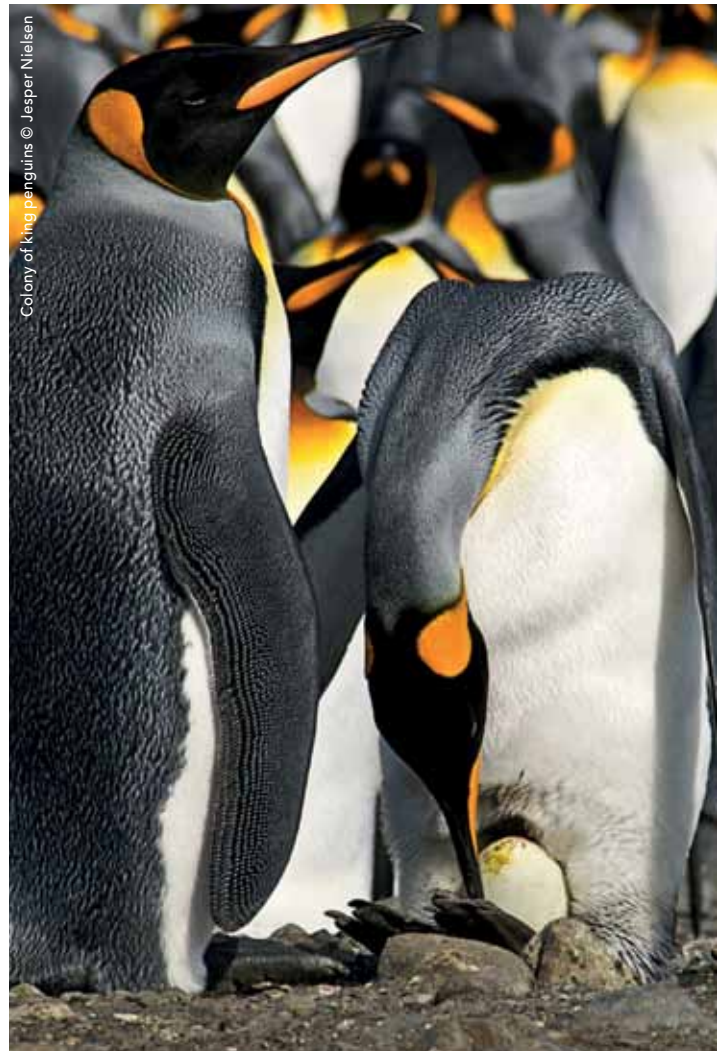
